to visit the museum.

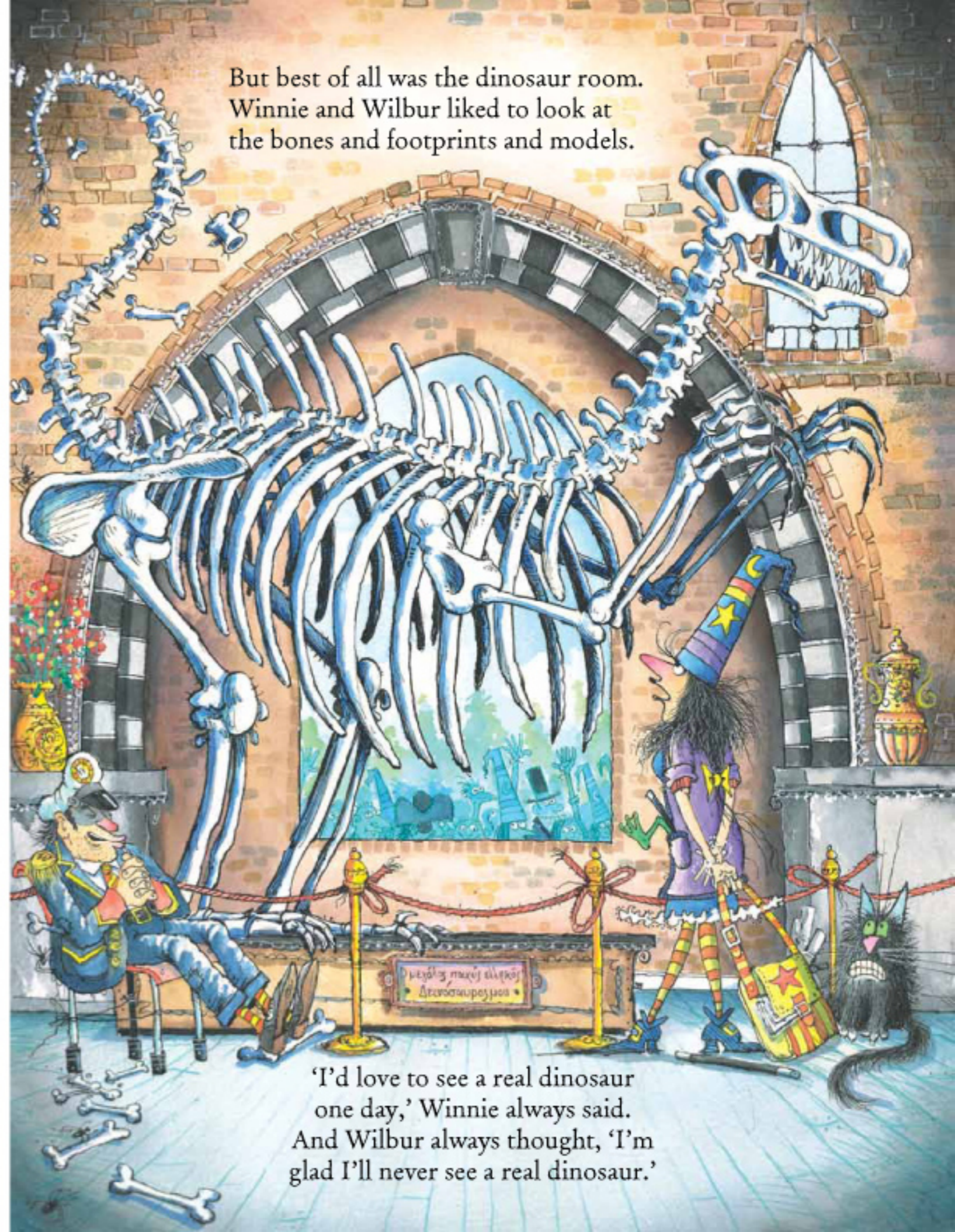
It was full of fascinating things.
