This level is suitable for students who have been learning English for at least three years and up to four years. It corresponds with the Common European Framework level B1. Suitable for users of TEAM magazine.

SYNOPSIS

Superman has been away from Earth for five years. He answered a call for help from his home planet, Krypton, and almost died there. Now he returns to Earth and re-appears as Clark Kent again. He returns to Metropolis to work for his old newspaper, the Daily Planet, and meets his former love, Lois Lane. Now she has a new man in her life, Richard, and a five-year old son, Jason.

Lex Luthor and his friends are in Metropolis too. Luthor plans to build a new world and destroy the old one. He causes some mysterious blackouts in Metropolis and Lois goes to investigate but she and Jason are caught by Luthor. Luthor steals Superman's crystal from the Fortress of Solitude and a meteorite with kryptonite from the museum in Metropolis. He uses the crystal and kryptonite to create a new land and causes a huge earthquake. Superman saves Lois and the world.

THE BACK STORY

Superman was created in 1932, by a Canadian artist (Joe Shuster) and an American writer (Jerry Siegel) and first appeared in a comic strip published by DC Comics. Since then, he has

appeared in comic books, radio serials, television programmes, films, newspaper strips and video games.

Superman Returns is the fifth Superman film. The popular TV series, *Smallville*, is about Clark Kent and Lex Luthor growing up together in the town of Smallville.

Superman Returns focuses on the fight between good (Superman) and bad (Luthor). In this story, Superman is not always so super and so perfect. He doesn't know where he belongs, on Krypton or on Earth, and he wonders if he should help people or not. In the end, good does not completely win over bad: Superman saves the planet but Luthor escapes.

HOW TO USE YOUR SCHOLASTIC MEDIA READER

Choosing and motivating

Is this the right story for your class? Have they heard of Superman? Have they seen any of the films? Do they want to read *Superman Returns*? If not, choose another book! Motivate students by telling them some background information and by reading aloud the first page of the story with dramatic atmosphere and emotion.

Organising

Plan a class reading schedule. Decide how many pages to set for reading each week. Select exercises from the back of the reader and extra activities from this resource sheet to go with each section of reading. (All answers on page 4.)

Using the DVD

Try to get the English language version DVD (with or without subtitles) of the film. Watch it yourself first in case there are scenes or language that are not suitable for your class. Show it in chunks of, say, 20 minutes in parallel with the class reading schedule. Alternatively, show the whole film in two sessions, perhaps over two lunchtimes when the whole class can get together. Ask students to identify and discuss any differences between the book and the film. There are other ideas for using the DVD in class on page 4.

Using the CD

Students can listen and follow in their books. They can listen and then read. They can read and then listen. All these options will enhance their understanding and speed up their reading.

Glossary

Go to *New Words!* on the inside back cover of the reader. Translate the words with the class or get students to find meanings at home.

Book exercises

Show students the Self-Study Activities on pages 62-64. These are divided into sections. They complete some exercises before they read a section, and some after.

Feedback

Have class feedback sessions each week. Talk and ask about the story so far. Get students to ask each other questions. Check resource sheet exercise answers with the whole class.

Fact Files

After the story, there are 4 Fact Files. Set these as self-study or use for whole class work. The files explore the themes of the story and relevant cultural contexts with interactive elements. Project ideas are on page 4.

What did they think?

Get everyone to do a written or verbal review of the book. Compare opinions. Will they read more *Superman* or *Smallville* stories? Will they go and see the film? Did you like it? Let us know at readers@link2English.com

FACT FILE FOLLOW-UP

SUPERMAN: THE FACTS (page 56)

Interview

Students work individually to invent a superhero they would like to be. They can use *Superman: the facts* on page 56 for guidance but can add any more details they choose.

Students then work in pairs to improvise an interview. One is a journalist asking questions. The other plays the role of their own superhero and answers the questions. This activity could be followed up by each 'journalist' writing a brief article about the superhero they interviewed.

THE SCIENCE OF SUPERMAN (page 57)

Research

Students work in small groups and research another superhero or comic book character (good or bad) e.g. Spiderman, Batman, the Joker, the Incredible Hulk, the X-men etc. What are their special powers? How did they get them? Can their powers be explained by science? Try to make sure each group chooses a different character. Each group makes a poster about their character. Put the posters up around the class so students can go around and look at them and ask questions.

EARTHQUAKES (pages 58-9)

Presentation

Students find out about natural disasters other than earthquakes, for example, volcano eruptions, hurricanes, floods or droughts. They work in pairs or groups and choose a topic to research. The pairs/groups make a poster to present to the rest of the class. The research may be done in the students' own language or in English but the poster and presentation must be done in English. Encourage other students to ask questions during the presentations.

21ST CENTURY NEWS (pages 60-1)

Survey

Students find out reactions to the stories and pictures in this week's newspapers, asking their friends, parents, relatives, teachers etc: *What did you think was the most interesting story in the papers this week? What was the most interesting picture?* They should make a note of the answers and then present their findings to the class. If possible they should also bring copies of some of the articles or pictures. Which stories and pictures were considered to be the most interesting overall?

DVD/CD FOLLOW-UP

If you plan to show the film in class, watch it yourself. Check that it is suitable. Identify good places to pause. Explain that the dialogue is fast and that students shouldn't be discouraged if they can't understand everything at first.

What happens next?

Freeze-frame a scene just before a dramatic moment. Students say what is about to happen and what has just happened.

Observing

Choose a scene before class and prepare questions on it. Tell the students to watch carefully and note down details about clothes, people in the scene, objects etc. Play the scene a couple of times and then ask questions, e.g. *What colour is Lois' dress? What can you see on her desk? Is she wearing a watch?*

Put it in context

Play short sections of the story. After each one, ask students to give the context, i.e. explain who the speakers are, where they are and what they are talking about. This could be a written quiz with students writing down the answers.
