NIGHT AT MUSEUM SECRET AT OMB

Level 2

This level is suitable for students who have been learning English for at least two years and up to three years. It corresponds with the Common European Framework level A2. Suitable for users of CROWN/TEAM magazines.

SYNOPSIS

Larry Daley is the night guard at the Museum of Natural History in New York. Every night the exhibits in the museum come to life, thanks to the power of Ahkmenrah's magic tablet.

When the story opens, everything is going wrong for Larry. With the help of the exhibits, he has organised a special show to celebrate the opening of a new planetarium. But there's a problem with the tablet and the exhibits start to attack the audience instead. Later that evening, Larry is upset to find out his son, Nick, wants to leave home.

Larry decides to take Nick and some of the exhibits on one last adventure. They go to the British Museum in London to find Ahkmenrah's parents and discover the secret of the magic tablet. There, Larry and his friends meet one of King Arthur's legendary knights, Lancelot. Ahkmenrah's father tells them that the tablet needs moonlight to restore its power but unexpectedly, Lancelot takes it from them. Larry and his friends chase Lancelot through London, but the power of the tablet is fading fast. Only when Larry's friends start to die, does Lancelot realise the importance of the tablet and of friendship. He gives the tablet back just in time for Larry to save his friends.

The exhibits return to New York but decide that the tablet should stay in London. Larry accepts their decision not to come to life again, but finds it difficult to say goodbye. He realises it is also time to let Nick go and for Larry to start a new life away from the museum.

THE BACK STORY

Night at the Museum 3: Secret of the Tomb, released in 2014, is the third film in the series. The first film, made in 2006, was based on the children's book by Croatian author Milan Trenc and set in the Museum of Natural History in New York. The second film (2009) takes place at the Smithsonian Museum in Washington. The star cast, clever and humorous storylines and excellent special effects have made the films very popular. In Night at the Museum 3: Secret of the Tomb Ben Stiller appears again as Larry and the film also stars Ricky Gervais, Robin Williams, Mickey Rooney, Owen Wilson and Steve Coogan. The film is dedicated to the actors Mickey Rooney and Robin Williams, who both died before the film was released.

HOW TO USE YOUR SCHOLASTIC READER

Choosing and motivating

Is this the right story for your class? Have the students seen any of the *Night at the Museum* films? Motivate them with background information (see The Back Story above) and by reading aloud the first page of the story.

Organising

Plan a class reading schedule. Decide how many pages to set for reading each week. Select exercises from the Self-Study section at the back of the reader and extra activities from this resource sheet to go with each chunk of reading. (All answers on page 4 of this resource sheet.)

Using the CD

Students can listen and follow in their books. They can listen and then read. They can read and then listen. All these activities will improve their reading speed and skills.

Using the DVD

Select the English language option on the DVD. The film is 98 minutes long. You could show it in chunks of, say, fifteen minutes, in parallel with the class reading schedule.

Glossary

Go to 'New Words' at the back of the reader. Translate the words with the class or get students to find meanings at home. The Vocabulary Builder on page 3 of this resource sheet practises the new words in a different context.

Casual language

Introduce the informal expressions used in the reader (see Vocabulary Builder on page 3 of this resource sheet). Put them into context. Ask students to look out for them as they read.

Fact File

Set this as self-study or use for whole class work. It provides background information on the British Museum.

FACT FILE FOLLOW-UP

THE BRITISH MUSEUM (Pages 50-1)

Research and present

Ask the students to research another exhibit at the British Museum or an exhibit at a national museum in their own country. They should try to find out some interesting facts and stories about it. They then give a short presentation to the class or group.

Discuss and plan

Ask students to work in groups and imagine that there is going to be an exhibition of some items from the British Museum at a local museum. They discuss the advertising campaign for the exhibition. They could think about:

- a poster for the campaign
- a flier with information about the exhibition
- a quiz for children who come to see the exhibition

Discuss and present

Ask students in small groups to think about what items from today might be in a museum in the future and why these items would be interesting for people in the future. The students tell the class their ideas and then the class votes on the best five items to put forward.

Research and write

Ask students to choose another famous museum in the world and research information about it. They could find out:

- · when it started
- what the building is like
- what sort of exhibits it has
- why it's popular

DVD/CD FOLLOW-UP

DVD: Observation

Play a short scene from the film and ask students to watch carefully. Ask questions about the scene afterwards. Then play another scene. In pairs, students watch and write at least two questions for another pair to answer.

CD: Differences

Choose three key words or phrases from a chapter of the reader. Write them on the board. Now play the CD recording of the chapter and ask students to note down one piece of information to go with each of the key words as they listen.

Example: (Chapter 2) newspaper

Possible answer: Larry read newspaper stories about the tomb where they found the magic tablet.

DVD/CD: Prediction

Read a chapter with the students and play the relevant part of the film or CD. Stop at points during the story and ask what happened next.
