
### Subjects and objects



## O Recap

Every sentence has a **subject**. The subject is the person or thing that does the action of the verb.

Many sentences have objects as well. The **object** has the action of the verb done to it.

Objects are usually nouns, pronouns or noun phrases.

# **B** Revise

Let's look at an example.

I am selling.

This sentence has a subject but not an object.

The verb is selling. I am doing the selling. I is the subject.

I am selling my bike.


In this sentence:

I am still doing the selling so I is still the **subject**. My bike is being sold. It is having the action of the verb done to it, so **my bike** is the **object**.

### In a sentence:

- subjects usually come before the verb
- objects usually come after the verb.
