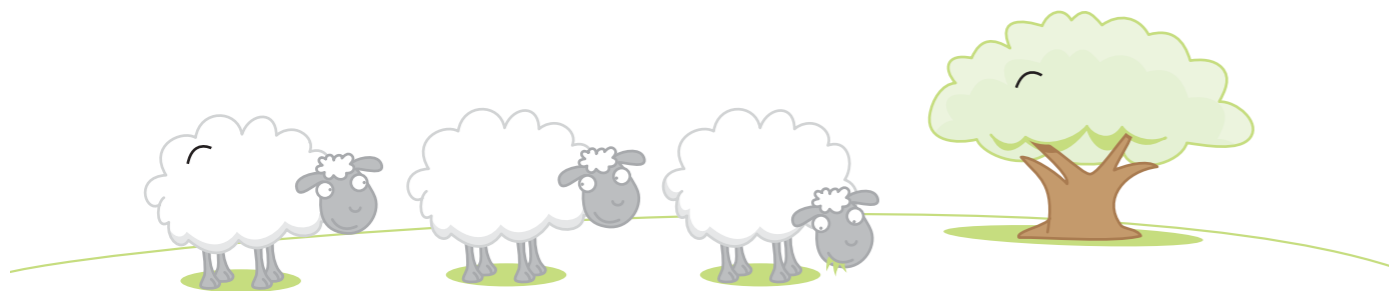


First up, back and around letter shapes

Trace over the curves.



Put the wool on the sheep and the leaves on the tree.



Trace over the letters and write some of your own.

Notes: These nine letters are made using curves, loops and circles f has curves at the top and the bottom, the line down is straight.
